The Value of Tuition in Modern Education Systems

Second, tuition providers have the flexibility and resources to step in to address complex needs promptly and effectively, whether this is funded by schools, government programmes (such as the UK's National Tutoring Programme), or parents on a private basis. Finally, the global tuition sector facilitates educational mobility, enabling students to transition between different education systems in an increasingly global world by providing the right preparation to select, apply and prepare for studying in another country. The talk will also address some of the challenges and how they can be addressed.



When Behaviour Speaks: A Relational Approach to Behaviour Across the GCC

Session Summary:

Join Jonathan Newport, Chief of Learning & Global Managing Director at Team Teach, for an engaging session exploring how a relational approach to behaviour can transform learning environments across the GCC. 


